TRS MLC booked

Two cases were registered against TRS MLC Mynampally Hanumanth Rao and four others late on Sunday for allegedly beating up two persons. According to complaints made to Pet Basheerabad Police, Dole Rajesh and P.M. Sai Prasad alleged that the MLC and his men had roughed them up. P.M. Sai Prasad, had alleged that he was being targeted as he had questioned the MLC's alleged possession of irregular and unauthorised structures.

The MLC had lodged a complaint against Rajesh and case was registered under the SC/ST Atrocities Act. Pet Basheerabad Inspector D.V. Ranga Reddy said the alleged fight between the groups happened at Cine Planet but the police also witnessed exchange of blows when the complaints arrived at the police station to register their complaints.

TRS leader on assault spree

■ MLC Mynampally attacks ex-TRS worker, RTI activist Sai Prasad

TRS city president and MLC Mynampally Hanumanth Rao and his men went wild at Petbasheerabad on Sunday night and assaulted a local politician at a wedding and an RTI activist at the police station.

Following complaints from the victims, police booked two cases against the MLC and his aides.

The incident began at KVR Garden function hall at night when Rao, who was not invited to the marriage, came to congratulate the bride-

groom on the stage. The first victim, Dolly Ramesh, who was a former camp follower of Rao, was getting on to the stage when Rao and his men were coming down.

"Rao got angry with Dolly Ramesh as he had left the TRS and joined the Congress a few months ago. Rao pushed Ramesh from the stage and started beating him up. Whoever tried to stop him was also beaten up," said a witness.

The incident began at KVR Garden function hall at night when Rao, who was not invited to the marriage, came to congratulate the bride-

groom's father, Malla

Reddy, who tried to stop the fighting, was also beaten up by the MLC," said Prasad.

After the fight, Dolly Ramesh approached the police, who then called Rao to the police station. When the police was talking to Rao and the complainant about the issue, the second assault took place.

"As Dolly Ramesh is a friend of mine I went to the police station to help him. As soon as I entered the station Rao saw me and rushed towards me asking me to leave. He beat me up although five policemen were in the room. When cops took me out of the station and locked the gate to rescue me, Rao's men jumped the gate and attacked me again," said Prasad.

Last year, in October first week, Alwal police had booked a case against Rao and his aides for beating up Prasad who had filed a PIL and an RTI petition against Rao and his wife

for allegedly grabbing a public park. Rao had allegedly been threatening to kill the RTI activist if he did not withdraw the PIL. The case is still being investigated by Alwal police.

Police said that they had launched an investigation. "We have booked a case against Rao under IPC Section 148 (unlawful assembly), 323 (inflicting injuries), and 506 (criminal intimidation)," said inspector D.V. Ranga Reddy of Petbasheerabad police.

Despite attempting to reach him several times on the phone Rao was not available for comment on this issue.

GREEN CHEATING

Green spaces vanish after layouts cleared

■ Civic rules require every layout to have green spaces

Layouts approved by the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) always have the mandatory 'green space' marked in the blueprint. However, in reality, this park space is either sold by developers and built upon, or encroached upon.

Civic rules require each layout to have green space, which includes a recreation space, sports club and park.

In 2016, the High Court took serious note of the neglect of this requirement and asked the GHMC to explain why it was not initiating action against offenders who grab park land.

The court also highlighted the government's apathy in developing lung spaces.

A senior officer in the town planning wing of the GHMC explains that private developers get their layout approved by showing that access have been reserved for parks or gardens. After getting the sanction to build, they violate the layout development rules. They produce fake plot numbers and get approval for building permission.

Such illegal actions are allowed even though inspections on the ground will bring the wrong doing to light. Town planning inspectors are hand in glove with developers.

The GHMC has found that park land in layouts in Rajendra Reddy Nagar (18 acres), Chandanagar, and Serilingampally were converted into plots with fake plot numbers and municipal permission for construction.

There was similar encroachment in Rock Town, Dilsukhnagar, where more than two houses have been constructed in space earmarked for a park.

In November 2016, the High Court, hearing a public interest plea, sought an explanation from the GHMC, authorities on their action plan.

TRS MAN'S WIFE BUILT ILLEGALLY

The wife of TRS' GHMC chief Mynampally Hanumanth Rao has built an additional floor without permission, an RTI query has revealed. Ms Vani Rao had sought permission from the Alwal municipal office for a ground-plus-three but built the extra floor without permission.

Mr P.M. Sai Prasad of Old Alwal filed the RTI query in April

and received a reply five months later. "The top floor that has no permission is around 5,500 sq. ft. The building was constructed over five years back," he said.

GHMC city planner Naramma confirmed that permission had not been given

Mr Hanumanth Rao claimed the structure was legal and that he had all documents. Asked for the papers, he said, "I don't have documents, you should check with the officials."

Due to the lack of an independent body, many of these cases are handed to the superior officer for departmental enquiry, which proves nothing against the accused officer. The accused simply gets away.

But while Telangana continues to drag its feet on the issue, neighbouring Andhra Pradesh initiated process of establishing the quasi-judicial body in 2015.

Hyderabad: Ten years after the Supreme Court ordered all states to set up police complaint authorities, to look into "all aspects of serious misconduct" by police personnel, the Telangana government has made no attempt to comply with the directive.

The issue came to light recently when city-based RTI activist, M Sai Prasad, wrote to chief minister N Chandrababu Naidu, seeking an explanation for the delay in setting up the authority. A copy of the letter was sent to Anand Sharma, director general of police and N Narasimha Reddy, state home minister.

Laying out the responsibilities of the body, the letter stated...

...how it "has left hundreds of victims and their families in the lurch". "This has allowed corrupt police officials to go free. This is the present reality of law and order systems in Telangana, despite the government's claim of 'brand' by policing," the letter read.

As an example, the activist has upheld a RTI case where an employee of the Atomic Minerals Directorate (AMD) ended her life due to dowry harassment by her husband. "It was shocking to read the suicide note of the deceased, where she revealed, 'Don't trust Bangalore police, they were lo-

...ght over by my in-laws, girls because of dress size," Sai Prasad wrote.

In the absence of an authority, which was expected to bring a change in the policing culture in the long run, complaints have been left with no choice but to approach senior politicians to register their grievances.

As per the National Crime Records Bureau's (NCRB) 2015 data, there were 95 complaints registered against policemen that year, with 40 among them filed against the city police. The prohibited state-level

HC to AP & T: Set up complaint panels on rights abuse by police

Hyderabad: Dealing with scores of petitions pertaining to police officials abusing common people in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, Justice A Ramalingeswara Rao of the Hyderabad high court has directed both the states to constitute the State Security Commission (SSC) and Police Complaints Authority (PCA) within three months from now.

This is in tune with the Supreme Court judgement in the Prakash Singh case and even though it is 10 years since that judgment containing several guidelines to the states was pronounced, these two mechanisms were not brought into existence so far, Justice Rao said. Once formed, all the complaints, including those that come to the co-

...urt, should be referred to the SSC and PCA, he said.

Detailing the apex guidelines, Justice Rao said PCA should be set up, both at district and also at the state level. While the district level PCA should be headed by a retired district judge, the state level PCA should be headed by a retired HC judge. The state can choose the state PCA chief from a panel of names sent by the chief justice of the High court, the judge

said. For the district level PCA, the CJ can either send a panel of names or he can authorise a sitting judge of the HC to do the same. These authorities will be assisted by three to five members depending on the volume of the complaints against police in districts. The members can be selected by the state in consultation with the Lok Sabha, state human rights commission etc.

Justice Ramalingeswara Rao also referred to the apex court direction about formation of SSC to ensure that a state government does not exercise unwarranted influence or pressure on the state police. Each SSC shall be headed by the chief minister or home minister as chairman and have the DGP of the state as its ex-officio secretary.

Irregularities in promotion in TS transport department

Irregularities in promotion given to certain employees in the TS transport department have surfaced. In 2016, the government issued 3 GOs directly promoting 3 Motor Vehicle Inspectors (MVI) to Road Transport officer (RTO), a post for which thousands of aspirants write the Group 1 examination. The GOs were issued as the files were signed at the Chief Minister's office. However, those affected have revealed and complained stating that the promotion 'clause' has been violated. A complaint was filed with the President of India against the actions of the government.

An employee in the TS transport department submitted a complaint copy to DC that stated, "Three junior motor vehicle inspectors K. Papa Rao, Dr K. Venkata Ramana and Dr Srinivas Puppala, were promoted to the post of Regional Transport officer. GO : Ms. No.17 (16th -2-2016), when there were many eligible candidates available, in violation of article 14, 16 of the Constitution. The three are juniors as two of them had joined in 2005 and one in 2010 as MVIs and were not

They claimed seniority in the cadre of RTO among other senior RTO's who were promoted prior to 2016. The MVI was promoted as RTO based on higher education qualification like Administrative officer violating Go. Ms. No. 180 TR & B (Tr 1) dated 1994.

A complaint has been filed with the President of India office against this violation. Mr Krishank Manne, the complainant said, "The promotions and posting of Mr K. Papa Rao, Dr K. Venkata Ramana and Dr Srinivas Puppala raise a suspicion that some of the junior most vehicle inspectors got promotions with power and pressurising the higher officials by relaxing and creating their own rules as a spe-

Why do pubs remain open after midnight: RTI activist

Hyderabad: At a time when the excise department is going hammer and tongs to curb the drug trade, a city-based RTI activist, **PM Sai Prasad**, on Saturday dashed off a letter to the state home department, questioning its inaction on bars and pubs which, he claimed, remain open till late at night.

In his letter to Rajiv Trivedi, principal secretary, home department (government of Telangana), he pointed out how there are many bars and pubs across Hyderabad, which serve its guests much beyond the official closure time of 12am.

Bars that I mentioned in the letter are Fat Pigeon-Bar Hop, Jubilee Hills, HyLife Brewing Company (Jubilee Hills), Zero 40 Brewing, Jubilee Hills and Over The Moon and Air Lounge and Bar (Jubilee Hills) that are open till as late as 3 am. The department has to regularly carry out inspections at these

pubs and bars. It is the responsibility of pubs to ensure that banned material like drugs are not used in their premises and they close the pubs on time," he said, alleging how these hang-outs have become a hotspot for both drug peddlers and consumers.

Prasad's accusations were, predictably, rubbished by Venkateshwar Rao, president of the Telangana State wine shop dealers association who said that people could procure drugs from anywhere, if they needed to do so. "The recent incident has shown that drugs were available even to school children. It is wrong to say that drugs are procured from bars and pubs alone. However, the fact that certain bars and pubs are given permission to stay open till 3 am is wrong," he added.

"Even the local police station must be aware of the pubs' working hours. If they allow them to operate, knowing well that they are flouting norms, even the police must be taken to task," he added.

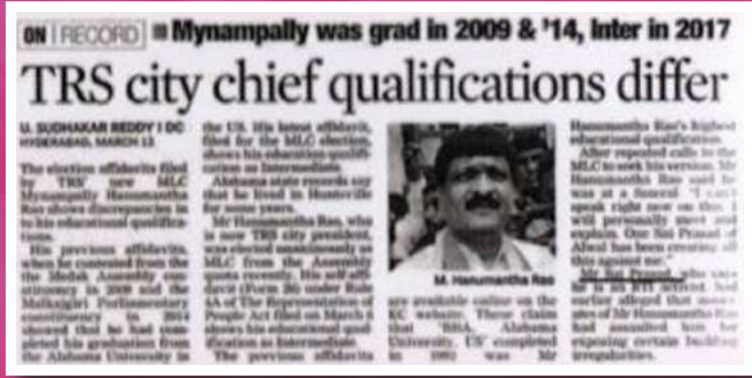

Illegal statues erected by GHMC member removed

VIOLATION OF 2013 SC ORDER

Hyderabad: A day after SC reported that the family of a deceased member of the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) Jyothi Goud, had erected two statues of her 27-year-old son who died while playing tennis, the authorities sprung into action and removed the statues.

In clear violation of Supreme Court orders, the members of GHMC had erected two statues of G. Anand Kumar on the Alwal Main Road and Old Alwal Crossroads respectively. GHMC officials said they had requested the removal of the statues as they were erected in violation of the SC order. "We want to remove them to the best of our power with the help of police but we have to do that," said K. Sridhar Reddy, GHMC secretary in charge of Alwal.

In 2013, the SC had directed to take provision and order that all state governments and Union Territories take necessary steps for removing statues.

The removal of statues was carried out peacefully.

A complaint member of GHMC, K. Sridhar Reddy, had erected two statues of her 27-year-old son who died seven months ago.

Civic body member erects 2 statues of deceased son

2 STATUES IN 10 DAYS

Hyderabad: In what appears to be a clear violation of Supreme Court orders, the family of a deceased member of the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC), Jyothi Goud, recently erected two statues of her 27-year-old son who died seven months ago. The statues of G. Anand Kumar, which came up over the last 10 days, are located respectively at Alwal Main Road and Old Alwal Crossroads respectively.

In 2013, the SC had directed to take provision and order that all state governments and Union Territories take necessary steps for removing statues.

Challenging the violation of the Supreme Court ruling, a RTI activist from the area, on Thursday shot a letter to K. T. Rama Rao, minister of municipal administration and urban development (MACE) urging him to take strict action against the family.

"If they want to build something in their son's memory they should build a monument

According to the SC order the state should not grant permission for installation of any statue or construction of any structure in public roads, junctions, sidewalks and other public utility places.

The duo Jyothi and her husband Mr G. Srinivas Goud are TRS party leaders from Alwal. The statues were installed without taking any permission from the GHMC".

Political signs, flexies to blame for Swachh score?

Hyderabad: Attributing Hyderabad's loss of marks in the national Swachh scorecard to flexies erected by private agencies and political organisations, Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) commissioner B Janardhan Reddy on Sunday asked that denizens go ahead and dial 100 and 040-2111 1111 (GHMC land line number) to report them.

As per norms, apart from advertising on legal hoardings, erecting any hoardings or flexies is illegal. Political parties are major offenders, say civic officials.

"Generally, we get information three to four hours after the banners or flexies are erected. We immediately respond and pull them down, but politicians who just see the erected ones and do not notice civic officials removing the flexies after a couple of hours argue with GHMC officials. I receive a lot of complaints regarding the flexie menace," said GHMC commissioner B Janardhan Reddy.

While Telangana Rashtra Samithi party-man Danam Nagender's flexis were among those of other politicians being taken down on Sunday, the commissioner's comment was a general remark, referring to hoardings of various politicians in the state. Flexies of politicians were seen at on the road connecting Nagarjuna Circle to Banajara Hills, Begumpet Airport Road and Malakpet private organisations.

Many coaching centres had erected flexies at several places including Ameerpet and Dilshuknagar.

When GHMC began removing the flexies of educational institutions in Ameerpet and Dilshuknagar, they took

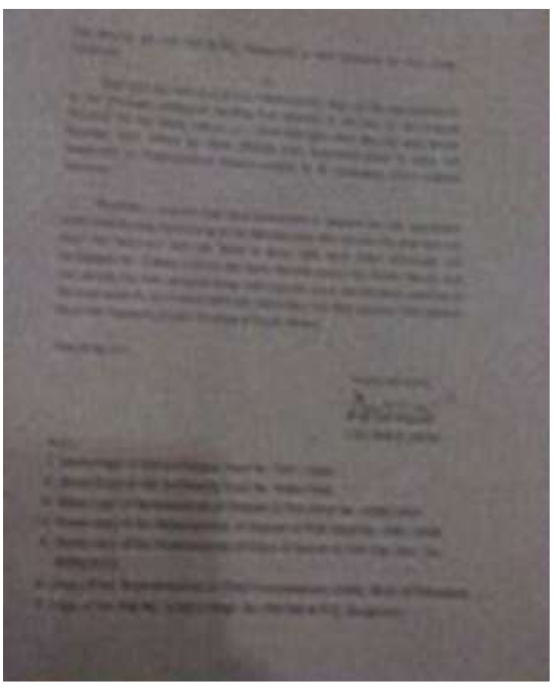
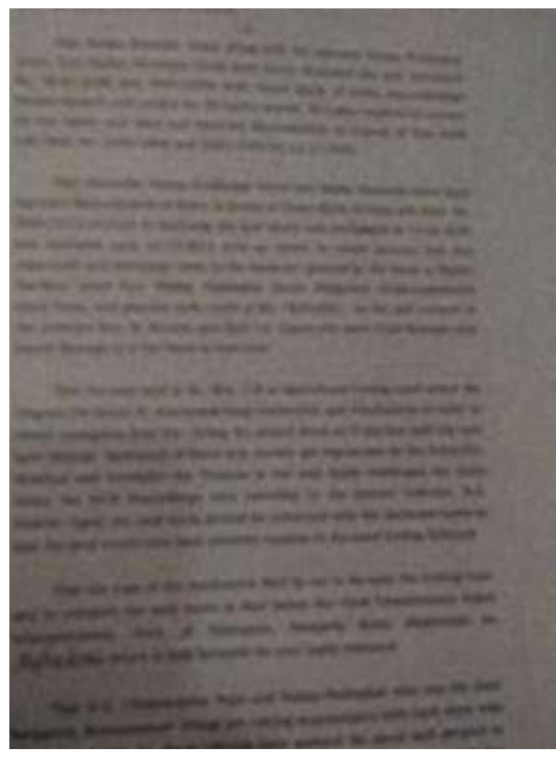
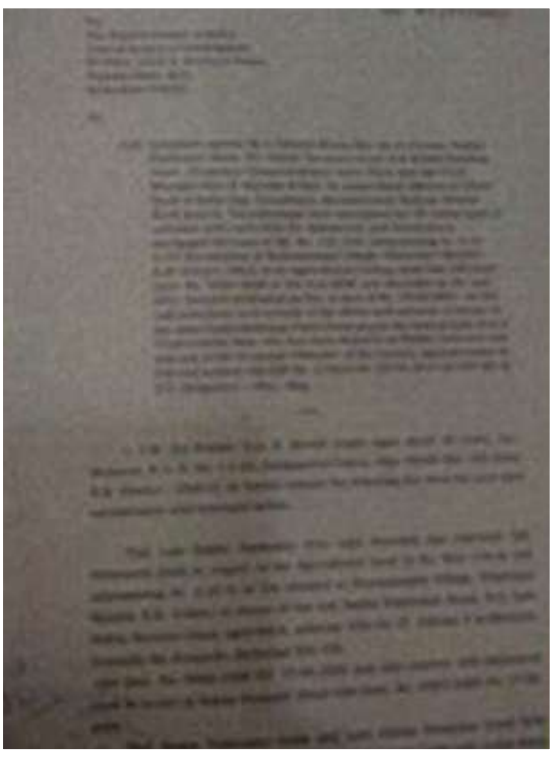
to erecting hoardings to the walls of their buildings, and pasting stickers on metro pillars and other walls.

Municipal Administration & Urban Development (MAUD) minister KT Rama Rao has strictly warned TRS party members against erecting flexies. TRS corporator Sunaritha Reddy was fined with ₹50,000, and former corporator MD Aslam Pasha was fined ₹25,000 in January when they erected banners and flexies to welcome MAUD minister KT Rama Rao.

The statement about flexies pulling down the city's rank in Swachh scorecard did not go well with activists. "The campaign for Swachh Survekshan Rankings should have been aggressive, flexies did not bring down the score much. People know about Swachh Bharat but are unaware about the term Swachh Survekshan," said P M Sai Prasad, a Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha (BJYM) leader and RTI activist pointing out towards the feedback section in Swachh score card where Hyderabad scored 942 out of 1,400.

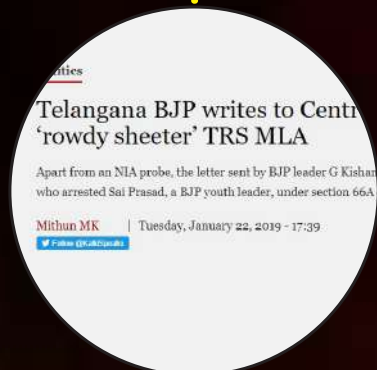
